- President report (Karen)
 - District changes: President of district 11, Everett, passed away in the process of officially changing; go directly to regional office in the interim
 - Town just emailed out the phase 1 feasibility study it's 40 pages long and available for everyone to review: <u>https://public.3.basecamp.com/p/zUDPCYKSrajtuhtP1ajAu4bq</u> most fields are a "D" rating, R1 = C rating and 2 fields are E rating.
 - Town asked who would be interested in participating in Phase 2 of the feasibility study. Confirmed representatives from our league would definitely participate and asked for information, dates, etc. - All league presidents rec'd report from Parks & Rec (Tiffany Quinn).:

 - Monthly account read-out / tax status
 - Annual budget need to establish planned revenue, planned expenses, wish list budget
 - Karen was able to submit our By-Laws and Constitution on the LL website
- Sponsor update(Seth) 6-10 new sponsors since last meeting; connected w/ Joel for ordering banners (if we order in bulk we can save money)
 - For 2024 look into option for sponsorship / donation for raffle prize; check w/ tax assessor in town for list of businesses and/or tap into CBA
 - Evan to provide list of supporters of the former Rotary club
- Action: Seth to send Matt sponsor logos so they can be loaded to the website (minuteman may have the logos, Joel and/or Tim Chiaverini)
- Financial aid committee update all applications have been reviewed and decisions have been made and communicated to applicants (Action: Donna needs to come off of all Treasurer emails - Karen/Matt will resolve)
- Safety plan updated and completed by board for 2023

- Safety briefing at April 3rd general meeting @ Abundant Life church. All coaches must attend that meeting; coordinators should plan to meet with coaches immediately following
- Raffle
 - Raffle is our league's primary revenue generator (along with sponsorships); helps pay for equipment, field maintenance, etc. (past enhancements include scoreboards, equipment)
 - Opinion: Raffle Prizes Gift cards or Items?
 - Some feel gift cards are more versatile (downside have to pay for the gift cards up front)
 - Some feel tangible items are more enticing
 - Others have seen cash prizes
 - Maybe ½ gift cards & ½ real items
 - We made the same profits either way
 - We need to know all prizes by end of March we tend to give raffle tickets to athletes in early April
 - 6 named prizes last year (3 tangible prizes / 3 gift cards)
 - Instead of buying products up front (look up prize in advance buy on amazon and have it shipped to winner)
 - Local businesses contribute and provide sponsorship
 - Downside to local businesses they're hit hard throughout the year from all sides
 - Recommend asking business to donate something that bring customers to them
 - 100% gift cards for 2023; immediately following discuss other options in conjunction with sponsorships
 - Decision for 2023 Gift Cards Only recommend 6th place = "Colchester Gift Card Pack" - lots of smaller gift cards to multiple businesses
 - Matt Parsons will explore prize packs for Sea Unicorns & Yard Goats, New Britain Bees & wooSox - for child prizes (scooners @ Dodd stadium)
 - Donna has list of logistics from 2022 and will share with Karen
 - Tim Chiaverini to coordinate; set actions list now
 - We will need volunteers to assist with parts of the raffle
 - Need to obtain town permit for Raffle once prizes are set
